

Welcome to Lake Frierson State Park. We hope your birding here will be a great success.

In July 2000, Lake Frierson State Park was officially designated a "Bird Sanctuary." At that time, a total of 98 birds had been documented over a period of seven years as using the park or lake habitat.

We ask for the help of bird enthusiasts like yourself to help us in keeping our checklist current by returning your checklist to the visitor center so that we may make a copy and include your information our next revised list.

Keep in mind that seasons sometimes overlap, thus some birds may arrive earlier and/or stay longer than the months indicated. In addition, the park habitat may be perfect for some migrating species to make it their permanent home and can be seen year round.

For the beginner, we suggest you consult a field guide such as those by Roger Tory Peterson for accurate identification. For your convenience, these may be purchased at the visitor center.

If you identify a bird not included on this list, please report it at the visitor center so that we may use the information in revising this checklist.
